Who we are

















- 56% of families have an annual household income below \$23,000.
- **70%** of clients are **Latinx**, 19% White, 8% African American.
- 87% of clients are female; 13% male.
- 44% of clients live in the 53215 or 53204 zip codes of Milwaukee.
- In 2021, CORE El Centro partnered with 10 local agencies to crossrefer clients and co-advocate for their healing and wellness needs.

This fall, an adolescent came to our No Worries Kids' Yoga, a 3-part series aimed at helping kids learn to reduce stress, tension, and anxiety through yoga and mindfulness. Her social worker (she lived in a group home) had sought out the opportunity for her and brought her to class.

When class began the young woman looked skeptical and guarded. She did not want to speak with anyone. We began class by asking if anyone would prefer to listen in Spanish because we had an interpreter, and anyone could move closer to them for that support. Her eyes brightened in that instant, and she moved to be close to the interpreter and received one-on-one attention and connection.

After class she held herself differently, her face was bright, and she said that she felt at home! She participated in the series with an open heart and signed up for several more classes in our program after that. The social workers who brought her to us said she loved it here and that was rare! On the third Saturday in the No Worries Kids' Yoga series, she came in beaming and shared that she had found her forever family! I'm not sure whether the time spent at CORE El Centro had any influence on her future connections, but we were so glad for the time she spent here and the memories that were made. We hope she will think of us as here at CORE as her forever home too!

In our community

CORE El Centro is proud to work with **Mujeres con Poder** (Women with Power) - a group of 8 Latina leaders and health promoters - who **impacted 4,396 neighbors in 2021** with their outreach, education, and activism on Milwaukee's Southside.

Mujeres con Poder participated in **62 community events** including walks with police, community meetings, neighborhood holiday celebrations, block parties, food pantries, school resource fairs, and open houses. **Key areas of focus in 2021: fostering communication and understanding between District 2 police and residents and combatting reckless driving.**

In our wellness programs

We provided **2,639 hours** of movement and mindfulness for **332 people** of all ages:



Approximately **60% of clients received their treatments at no cost** thanks to supporters like The EverydayGood Foundation, The Office of Crime Victim Services, and donors supporting our Thriving with Cancer program and general funds to cover the costs of clients qualifying for the maximum discount on services.

The remaining 40% of clients used our sliding scale fee structure based on income and dependents and paid an **average of just \$20.33 per treatment.**
